GARDEN OPENING

The Committee reminds members who have volunteered to open the garden that they must remain at the garden for at least an hour. Some members need to make special arrangements to support their attendance at the garden while others have to travel considerable

distance and are not able to arrive at the opening time. Should the rostered gardener have another commitment on that day, then they should arrange for another key holder to open the garden for them. Some circumstances may arise on the day of opening. If you cannot arrange a replacement in this instance then call Kevin.

TOILET ACCESS

The Committee will write to Council to request the installation of a gate between the shelter and storage shed to allow for more direct access to the tennis court toilets.

PLANTING OF TREES

One of our prevailing philosophies at the garden is respect for others. Please do not plant substantial trees or plants as they may shade other gardeners' plots and deplete the soil of nutrients. Gardeners should also avoid planting thorny, invasive or rambling plants.

GREEN HOUSE REPAIRED

The Greenhouse is repaired and should provide us with similar service to last year in helping establish seedlings for the open day plant sale. If we are lucky, it might last for next year's plant sale too. In the mean time, the Committee will research and price an adequate replacement.

PREPARING FOR SPRING

It is time to consider what to plant for Spring and Summer. Remember to rotate your crops to prevent your soil being depleted. It is good idea to plant a pea/bean or legume crop in Winter to replace nitrogen and reduce chemical fertiliser dependency in the warmer months.

USING BLOOD & BONE


B&B is an excellent source of nitrogen. Gardeners should be cautious when using B&B as overuse can be harmful to seedling roots in their early stages and can increase the occurrence of insect infestation. A couple of large handfuls scattered over a plot is sufficient.

THINK ABOUT YOUR CROP

It is important to think about what part of the vegetable you are eating and use nutrients accordingly through organic methods. Nitrogen (N) causes leaf growth, phosphorous (P) encourages root growth and potassium (K) encourages flowers and fruit.

So if you are planting swedes and carrots, they are root vegetables. If you add too much blood and bone (which is mainly nitrogen) you will find that too much nitrogen will cause them to put all their energy into producing leaves. This isn't what you want.
