## April s355 Committee Meeting

The Committee had determined at the last meeting that some of the original garden plot edging needed to be replaced. It was decided that it should be constructed similar to the last garden plots developed by Council. Costs were anticipated to be approximately \$3000.00 and it was agreed that we would approach Council to fund these works. The Garden would contribute \$300.00 and volunteered the labour to construct. We have since learned that Boystown would again like to undertake some construction work in our Garden. We will continue to liaise with Council and Boystown to get this project completed.

Treasurer John reported that we had \$8 013.00 in savings and \$67.00 in petty cash.

The Committee has approved to buy a stall at the Mothers Day event to be held Saturday 4 May at the Our Lady of Queen of Peace Church at Greystanes. We will be selling a range of plants, cakes, jams, pickles and craft items. If you can help in some way, please advise Robyn.

The recent Garden Induction Program was successfully completed by many of our new and recent members. Another will be held around July for new members and as a catchup or refresher for other members.

Planning is underway for our Open Day (12 October 2013). Please talk to Liz or Robyn to find out how you can help before or on the day.

## Planting now



Sow these seeds directly into your garden:  
beetroot, broadbeans, carrot, endive, fennel, garlic, lettuce, mizuna, pak choy, peas, radish, rocket, silver beet, snow peas, swedes and turnip.

These seedlings can be planted in your garden:  
broccoli, Brussels sprouts, cabbage, cauliflowers, leeks and onions.
