Reminder to Keyholders

There are a few simple procedures to be followed so our garden is secure.

- ◆ If you open the garden it is your responsibility to close everything before you leave and make sure the tank pump is turned off.

What if someone comes when you are there?

- ◆ Talk to them and if they are a keyholder and wish to stay, then write in the attendance book that they are staying and you have asked them to lock up.
- ◆ If they are a garden member, but not a keyholder, they must leave when you leave.

Please note that only keyholders can unlock the garden and the key cannot be given to another person to unlock and attend the garden.

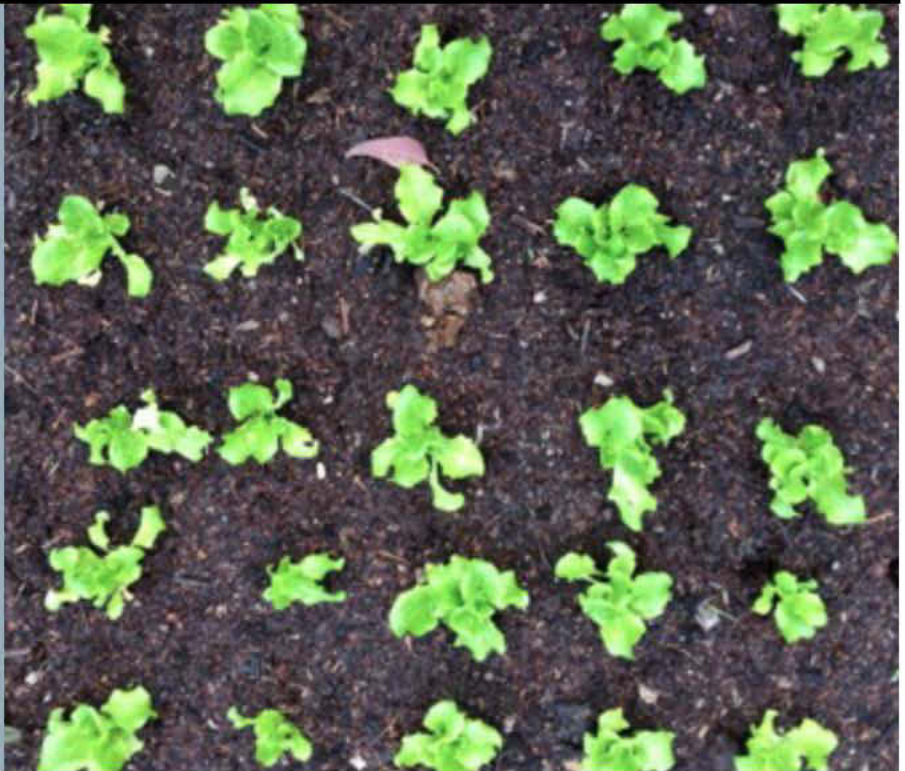
PLANTING NOW IN THE GARDEN

Sow directly into your garden beans, beetroot, carrots, cucumber, endive, lettuce, mizuna, pak choy, raddish, silverbeet and turnips.

IN THE GREENHOUSE

Sow into seed trays then plant out in 4-6 weeks. Broccoli, cauliflower, leeks and onions.
